

Scholarship Information & Regulations

There is only one set of application forms. Application for General AND Division Scholarships require the ORIGINAL and EIGHT copies of the scholarship forms, documents, and letters to be submitted to the NC Division Chairman of Education (Division 2nd Vice President) prior to **MARCH 15** for General scholarship and **MAY 1** for Division. Any student may apply for a General Scholarship but only those attending a NC college may apply for a Division Scholarship.

- All checks for scholarships are made twice a year payable to the college or university.

- A student leaving college or not completing a full academic load shall forfeit their scholarship.

- All students awarded UDC scholarships must report by letter, enclosing a **certified** copy of transcript of semester grades, to the Division 2nd Vice President within 30 days after the end of each semester. Additionally, students **must request in writing** to be considered for re-award for the following semester. Any student not complying with this rule will automatically have the scholarship terminated.

- A CHECKLIST of Instructions and Requirements will serve as a COVER PAGE for the application in order for the student, Chapter 2nd VP, and Division 2nd VP to be sure that all required documents are included and signed, in the SEQUENCE indicated.

- Although the NC Division offers 15 Scholarships, not all are available every year.

- Applicant does not apply for a specific scholarship. The Division 2nd Vice President and Education Committee determine which winning applicants receive which scholarship.

Read this circular carefully and then check for eligibility. Contact your Division 2nd Vice President for further information and application forms.

The Dover Scholarship recipient is selected by the Cleveland Guards Chapter 143, Shelby, and approved by the NC Division Education Committee.

The Annie Rogers Newell and Lula Faye Clegg Scholarships are selected by the Stonewall Jackson Chapter 220, Charlotte, and approved by the NC Division Education Committee.

The James B. Gordon Scholarship is selected by the James B. Gordon Chapter 211, Winston Salem, and approved by the NC Division Education Committee.

The Dr. Fabius Haywood Scholarship, is awarded to a student endorsed by a District VI Chapter and approved by Education Committee.

Rules Governing Awards

Tenure: All Scholarships listed in this circular are available for a maximum of four years, or eight consecutive semesters, or until the student fails to make a minimum 3.0 Grade Point Average per semester. Students must have a 3.0 GPA to be eligible for either a General or Division scholarship.

Students must be enrolled in an accredited College or University in the United States for General Scholarships and in a North Carolina school for Division Scholarships. They must carry a minimum of twelve hours each semester. Should the student not graduate in 4 years, the scholarship remains only for the expected time of their original graduation date.

Applicants: Each Chapter in the Division may present any number of candidates for an available scholarship.

Qualifications

- Applicants must be LINEAL descendants of worthy Confederates. An applicant who is a COLLATERAL descendant must be a member of the CofC or UDC.
- Applicants must be endorsed by the President and 2nd Vice President of Chapter and Division.
- Application must be made on the General Organization's official form. Final approval is made by the Education Committee.

- All information requested must be supplied.
- Use full names (no nicknames)
- In addition to the information on the application, certificates, records, proofs, and endorsements are to be furnished by the student:
 - Certified proof of Confederate Military Record of one ancestor with company and regiment. This document may be obtained from the Archives of Confederate Records in State capitols, the National Archives and Record Services in Washington, DC, or the UDC Business Office in Richmond, VA.
 - Completed Lineage Sheet linking the applicant to their Confederate ancestor by generations. A copy of an approved UDC or CofC application is accepted as proof of service.
 - A copy of the applicant's Birth Certificate
 - A letter of Endorsement from a sponsoring chapter of the UDC.
 - A letter of Recommendation from a recent teacher or counselor with an objective evaluation.
 - Complete Financial report form completed
 - Official Certified transcript of grades for the previous year and Fall semester from the school attending
 - Signed and dated personal letter from the applicant pledging to make the best possible use of the scholarship with goals and objectives outlined.
 - Furnish one wallet size photograph (head and shoulders)
 - Name and address of college or university to be attended and course to be pursued or proposed or current major.
 - Incomplete applications will not be considered.
